The Social Paediatric Centre is a medically managed outpatient facility for the diagnosis and treatment of children and adolescents. Many different professional groups work in our SPC, such as doctors, psychologists, therapists, social pedagogues and curative pedagogues. Together we carry out a detailed diagnosis of your child. In this way, the current development can be assessed and the causes clarified. Together with the child or adolescent, his or her parents or caregivers, a plan of action is then drawn up. We recommend outpatient and inpatient therapies and support, assist you in social legal matters and support you in taking the right steps with your child. We are well networked with authorities, educational institutions as well as outpatient and inpatient medical facilities and are happy to make this knowledge available to you.

We are specialised in the treatment of children and adolescents with

- abnormalities in the development of speech, motor skills, cognition, behaviour and emotions
- neurological disorders, such as epilepsies, cerebral palsies, neuromuscular disorders, multiple disabilities, autism, chronic headaches, spina bifida
- developmental risks after premature birth, infections or trauma
- speech, language, voice, swallowing and feeding disorders
- genetically determined developmental disorders / diseases
- mental illnesses and behavioural problems
